


















Cars hit cows

• TWO motorists travelling in opposite directions had a miraculous escape from serious injury when they hit a herd of cattle five kilometres west of Nobby last night.

The accident occurred at 7.20pm on the Nobby-Felton Road.

Officer-in-charge of the Clifton police station Sergeant Guy Smidt said the drivers suffered minor seat belt and air bag injuries in the crash.

"One driver was transported to hospital by ambulance for observation, but there do not appear to be any serious injuries," Sgt Smidt said.

"They both had an extremely lucky escape.

"A couple of seconds sooner and we would have had a head-on."

Sgt Smidt said a 2007 Mazda utility travelling east from Pittsworth to Clifton had made the initial impact with cattle that had strayed onto the road. The second car, which was travelling west from Toowoomba to Pittsworth, hit a dead cow and became airborne, narrowly missing the other vehicle.

The road was closed for nearly an hour.

Both vehicles were extensively damaged and had to be towed from the scene.

Three dead cattle were removed from the road.
